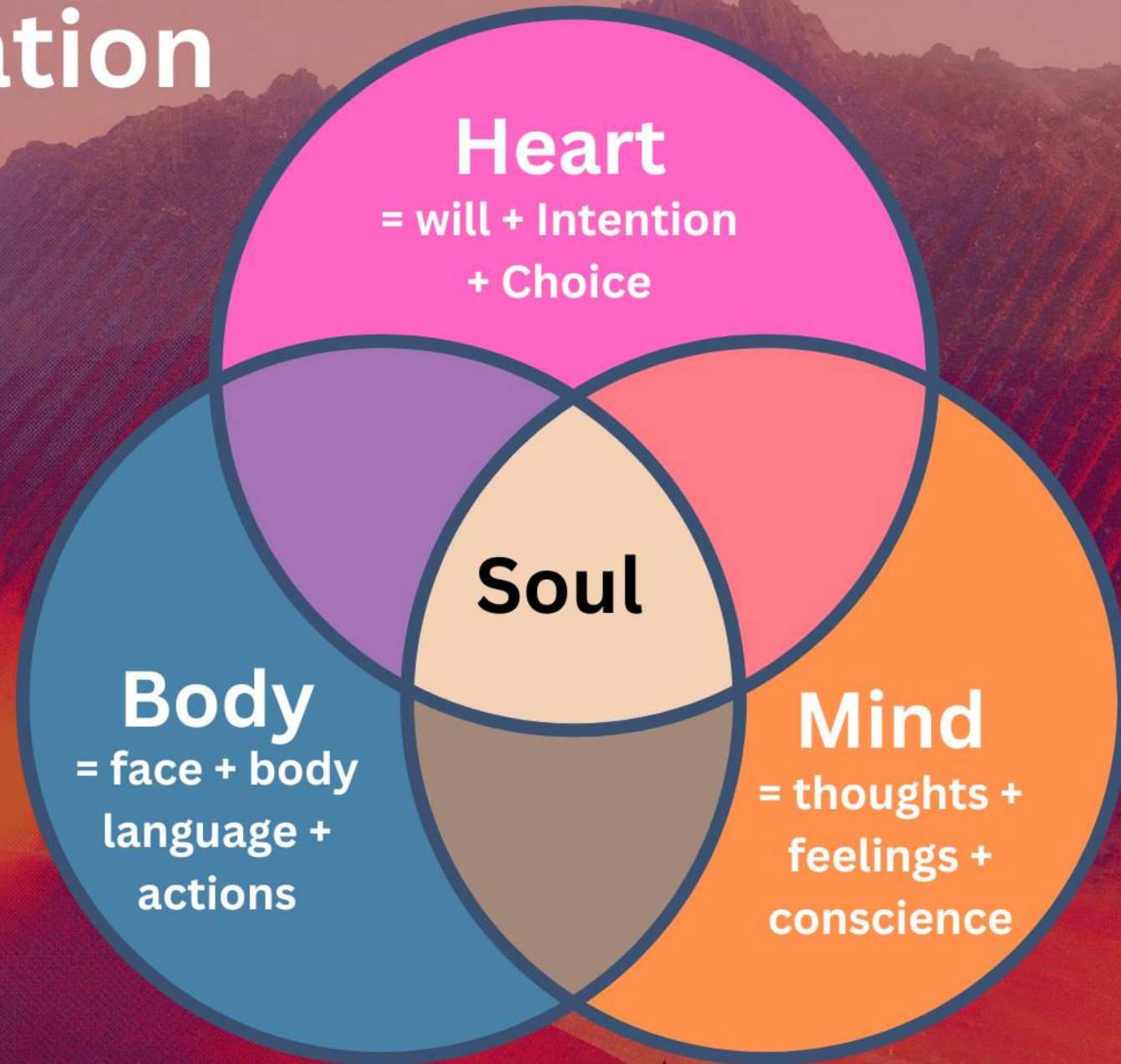

Einstein's famous equation of $E=mc^2$ suggested that if you convert mass to energy, you will release a huge amount of energy from a small amount of mass.

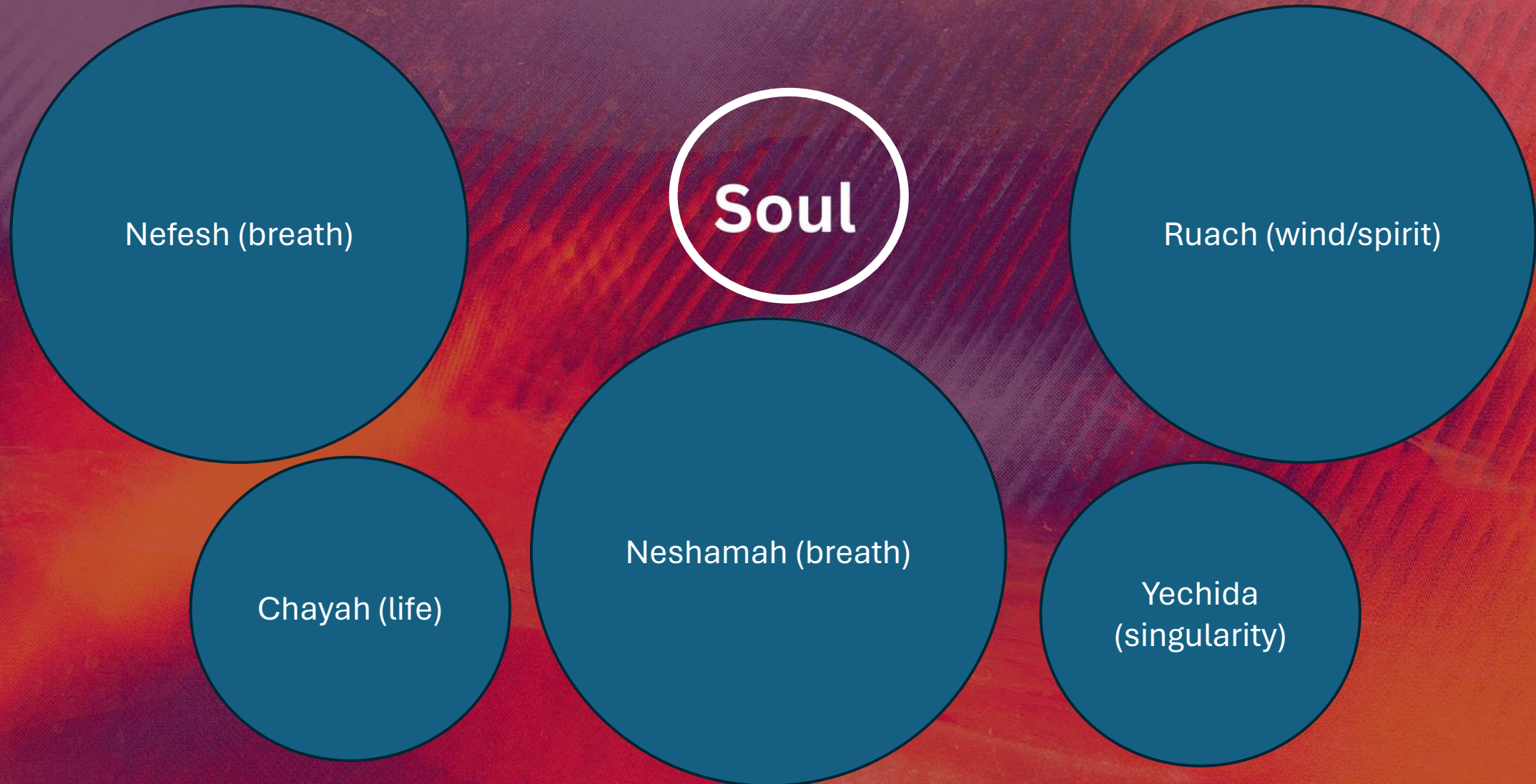
Was he wrong?

It was the basis for the atom bomb!

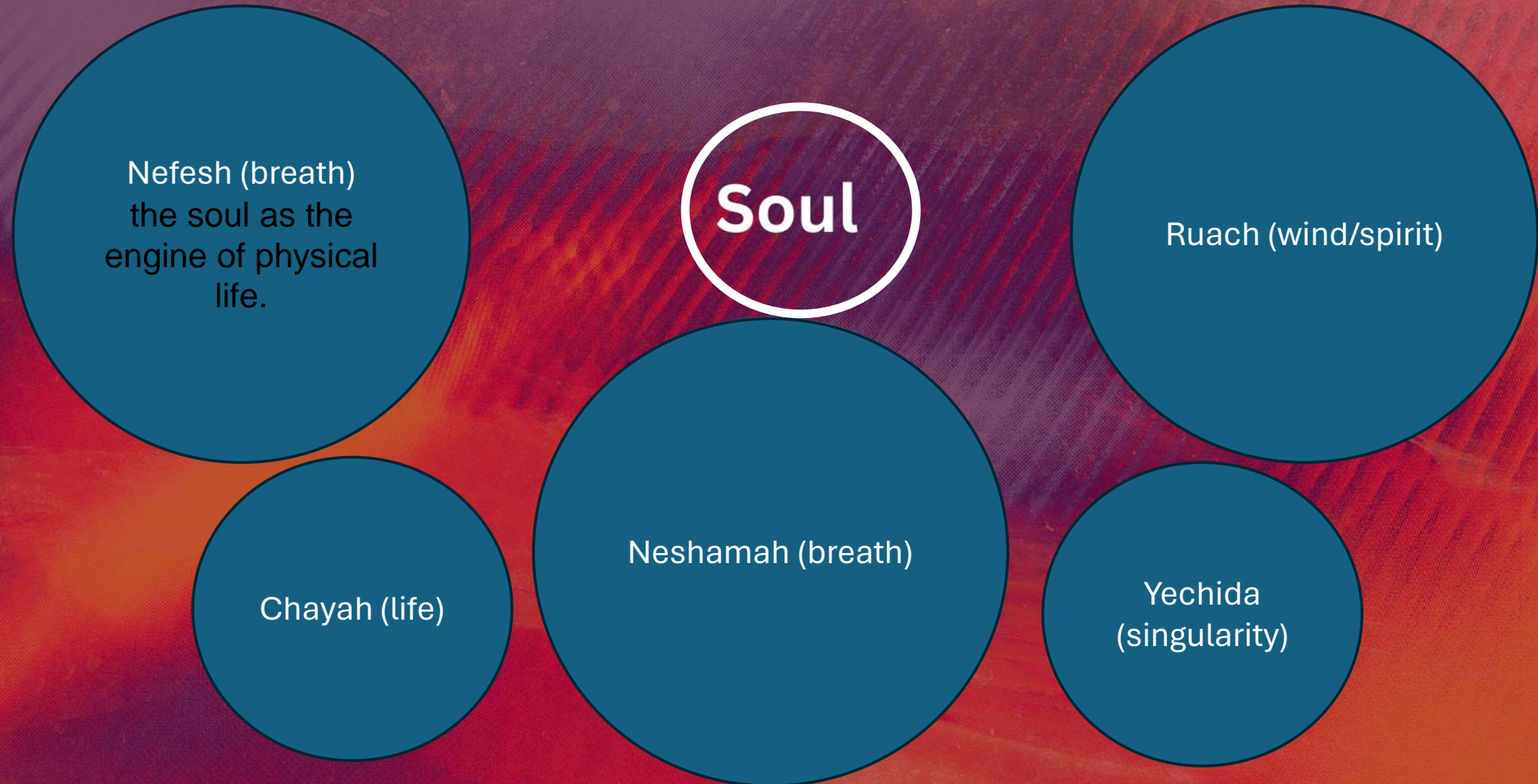
What can we find if we look at the soul in a similar way.

Considering its parts and the impact of releasing the energy within those parts. What else lurks in this hidden place?

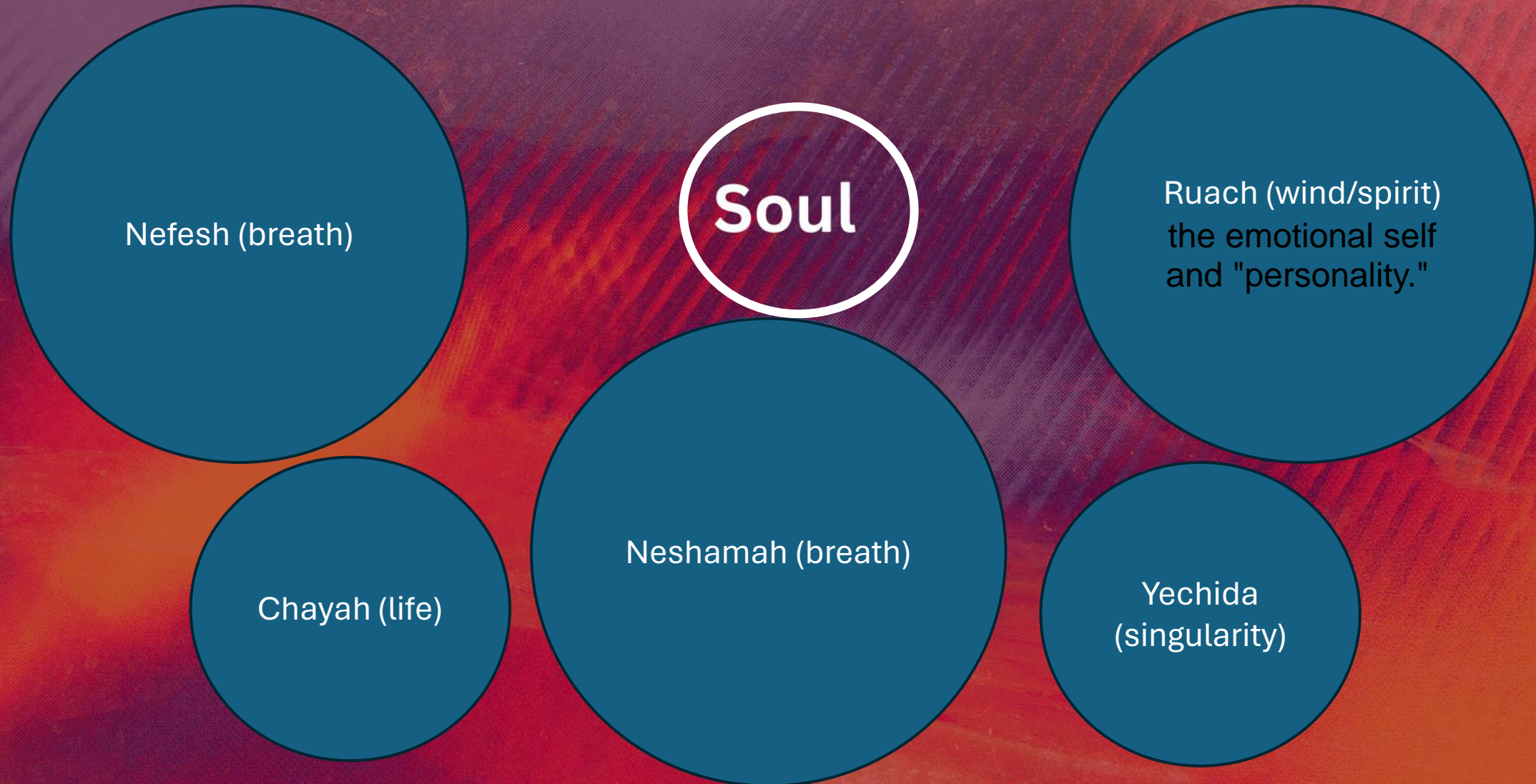

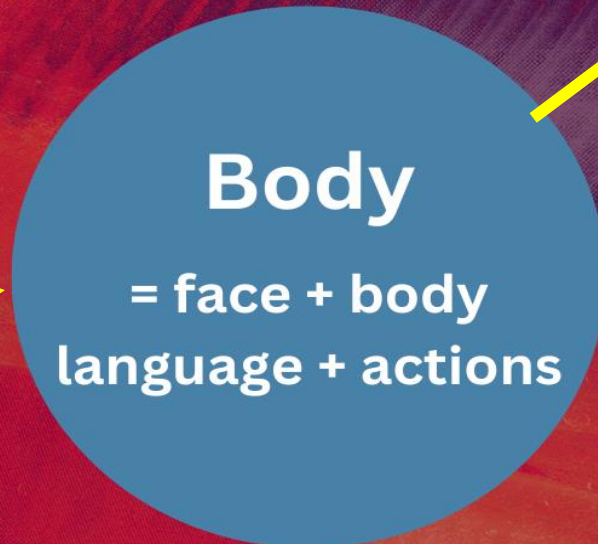
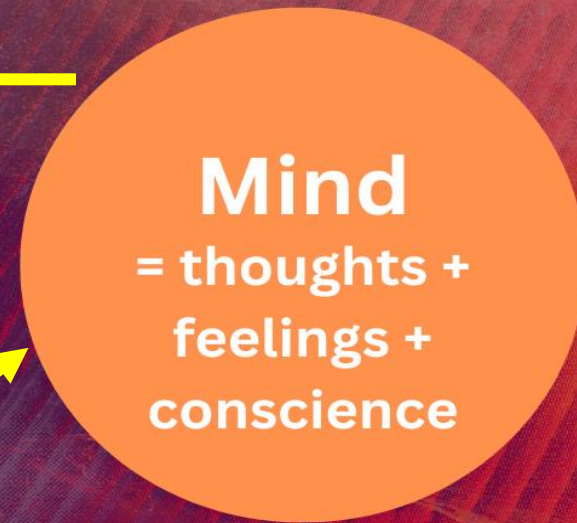


Flow to achieve integration

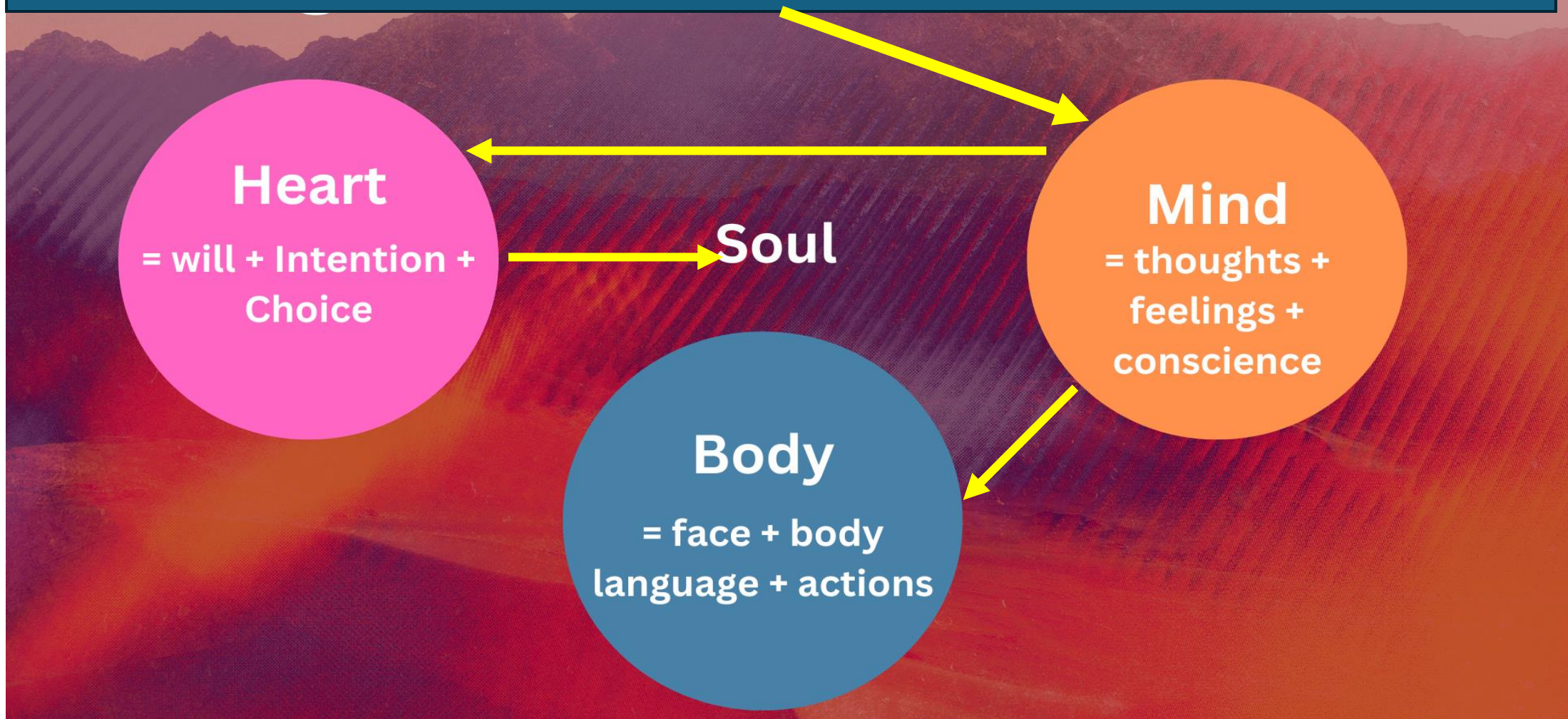


Nefesh

the soul



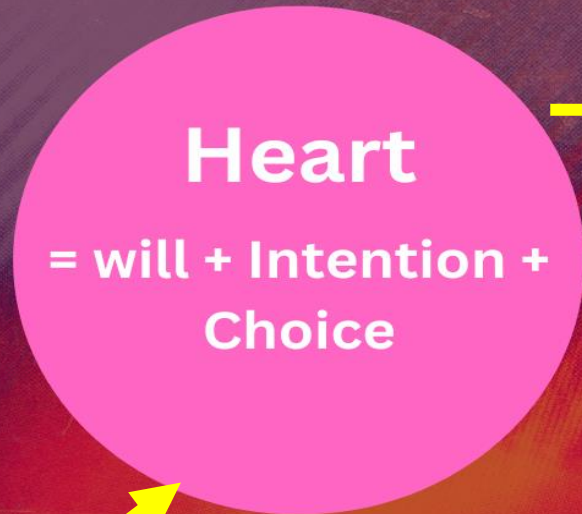
Flow to achieve integration

Comes from the soul

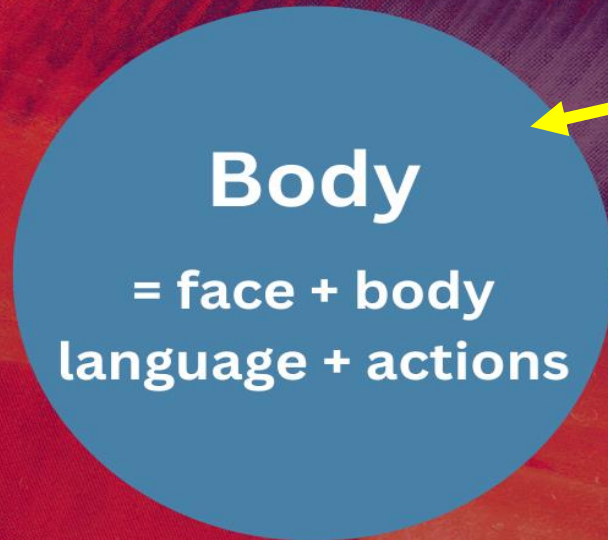
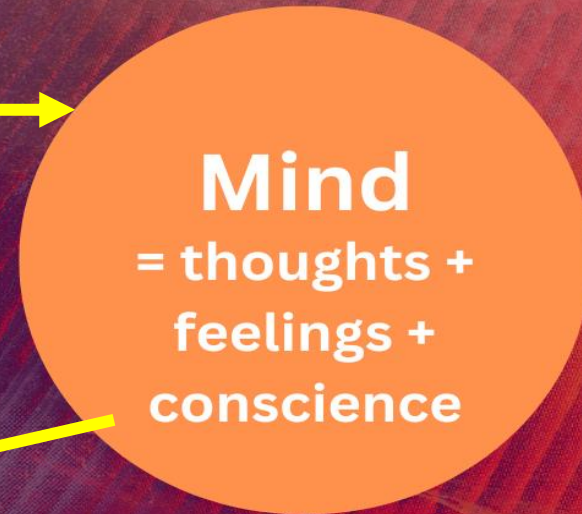


Flow to achieve integration
